FROM THE PASTOR

A few weeks back lots of clergy were sharing a blog post by a senior pastor of a large congregation who had decided to leave both his church and pastoral minis-

try. It's gotten a lot of response—first from a lot of pastors saying "Ohmigosh yes! I relate to this!" to a lot of other pastors and laypeople critiquing the post for what they saw as the pastor's lack of understanding of his people. I get the tension.

Along with others, I found things in it that I relate to and things that raise questions for me. There was one dynamic the pastor mentioned that triggered a lot of reflection; he said that pastors understand our role to be about helping people grow in faith, while the assumption of many church members is that the pastor helps people *sustain* their faith. He used the terms "Growth Mindset" and "Fixed Mindset" to describe a fundamental disconnect--which helps explain why many people were offended. It's easy to take this to mean church members are simply closed-minded and/or lazy. (And while I wouldn't say this as a blanket statement. I have to confess that there have been times when I could relate to his frustration.)

One excellent response from a licensed clinical therapist pointed out that "fixed mindset" is a normal response to an experience of trauma. People who are struggling to just hang on and get through the day hold on tight to what they know, seeking some solid foundation to cope with the chaos life is throwing at them. These days, that can be pretty much everyone. Hence, I suppose, all the conversations we have as a congregation about change and growth. Everyone agrees it's necessary, but a bunch


of us hate it anyway, especially in the place that we're looking to for some sense of stability and comfort.

So what do we do with this dynamic? I think a healthy church will understand that faith needs to be sustained but also stretched. Pastors need to understand why people want to hold on to the status quo and hear their experience with compassion. Pastors also need to heed the call of the Gospel to lead people through the morass of false promises offered up by our culture/society/systems as an answer to our fears, and point them to the solid promises of God.

And parishioners need to understand *why* their pastors are pushing so hard at their comfort zones. Not out of a sense of superiority or general "I've-had-it-with-youpeople!" orneriness, but out of a sincere desire to offer you more. More courage, more understanding, more confidence, more and deeper faith. We really do love the Gospel and you—and we want to serve both faithfully. There is so much pain in the world, and we believe that much of it could change if we were all better at seeking More God. (Not just what we want from God, but what God wants us to want from God.)

When you are weary of changes in your faith community, try to remember that your pastors are trying their best. When you need to catch your breath, let your pastor know. Remember that the things that are wearing you out may be energizing your neighbor. Talk to one another. Grow in faith by sharing yours. Remember that faith is

about finding comfort but also providing comfort to the other. And remember that God is big enough.

MONDAY EVENING BIBLE STUDY

The Monday evening Bible study group began on Monday, September 11 at 7:00pm and are studying the minor prophets Amos and Hosea.

These minor prophets come from the period when there were two Hebrew kingdoms, Israel in the north which had a succession of dynasties, and Judah in the south which remained loyal to the House of David and contained the Jerusalem Temple. Our featured prophets preached the Word of God in the Northern Kingdom during its declining years. Israel was captured and destroyed by the Assyrians in 721 BCE.

Amos, although a citizen of Judah, was called by God to preach in the Northern Kingdom of Israel, likely during the decade 760 - 750 BCE. During this time, Israel enjoyed peace, and an elite enjoyed great prosperity. However, the society was unjust to the ordinary person. Amos preached against this social inequity. Needless to say, he became unpopular with the king and with the king's paid clergy in the substitute temples of the Northern Kingdom.

Hosea preached and wrote in Israel from around 750 BCE until the Assyrian capture in 721 BCE. He provided a sharp critique of the political, social and especially religious acts of the Northern Kingdom as related to an idyllic time in the past, using a lot of graphic imagery. He predicted the fall of the Kingdom and considered it to be God's judgment. Like Amos, he was unpopular.

We will use Kerygma Bible study materials. The writer of the Resource Book for Matthew is Dr. George W. Ramsey, Professor Emeritus of Bible Studies from Presbyterian College in Clinton, SC. The sessions include a video presentation by the author. Participation will be possible in person in the Education Office and via Zoom link.

The Monday night group has become cohesive over the years, sharing conversation as well as our Bible study. Still, there is always room for more, and we will make you feel welcome. Kindly contact Mark Hamilton or Vince Hardt if you have not participated before so that we may order course materials for you and add you to our Email list.
