FROM THE PASTOR



Well, this Advent is taking on a whole new level of complicated feeling for me. So this next-to-last note from me is a bit of a rambling rumination that reflects a lot of different feelings....

I'm in a whole new place of waiting to let go of what I know and entering into something I've never experienced. Waiting for the time of loss and goodbyes and sadness, and waiting for a time of relationships rekindled and new joys discovered. Waiting for a change which is completely normal and expected and still huge and disconcerting.

Advent has never felt quite like this, for me. As I think about it, I'm realizing that if I were ever able to get my head out of all the *expected* Advent experiences, this might be what I would have felt every year.

We usually focus of the preparation part of Advent, which makes a lot of theological sense. We are preparing our hearts and minds to receive what God has promised. But I wonder if I have gotten into a Preparation Rut that defeats the whole purpose. So often I prepare for what I expect. (And, let's be honest, what you expect....) When what I think God wants is for me to learn to prepare to receive what I didn't expect.

So much of the blessing and promise God sets in our path is unexpected. When our eyes, minds and hearts focus on what *should* be there it's just so, so easy to miss all the wonderful stuff in between and around what we're looking at. Nobody noticed Jesus when he

was born. His mom was too poor, too unimportant. His dad was too powerless. It took a whole host of angels to make the shepherds pay attention—and then everybody ignored them, too. Only a small, small handful of people noticed when God gave Earth the answer to its yearning.

And today the whole world is still filled with yearning. Which sounds sort of sentimental and beautiful but really is a pretty uncomfortable place to hang out. Just like 2000 years ago, some people self-medicate that yearning with rage, others with deflection, denial and over-consumption.

In Advent, God asks us, I think, to make space and time for the yearning even though it can be uncomfortable to really sit with. We're used to thinking of this story as something that happened 2000 years ago: "The world longed for peace. Jesus was born. Problem solved." But the coming of Jesus wasn't just "once upon a time." The yearning is every single day. The need for God's Promise is still every single day. God's act of saving the creation from death is every single day. The intentional act of opening ourselves up to receive the thing that we didn't expect to give us life is still every day.

We are still longing to be saved from the pain in this world. God is still being born in small, unrecognized places. Things will continue to change, we'll still sometimes feel overwhelmed. But God will continue to show up. Whether or not we


always recognize that.



MONDAY EVENING BIBLE STUDY

Beginning on **December 4, 2023, at 7:30pm**, the Monday Evening Bible Study group will read and discuss the Gospel of Mark, which was the first written and the shortest of the Gospels in the Bible as it has come down to us. This Gospel will also be the focus of the Gospel lessons read in worship for the coming year.

Traditionally, this Gospel is said to have been written by John Mark, an early missionary companion of Paul, in Rome based upon the recollections of Peter, the closest companion of Jesus. The Gospel concentrates on the events, with some parables and other teachings, but moves quite rapidly through the public ministry first of John the Baptist and then of Jesus. There is no Christmas narrative. Mark provides the underlying structure of Matthew and Luke, who add much of the teaching ministry to it. Studied on its own, Mark shows what the early church, post-Resurrection, looked back and saw as the key essentials of the life of Jesus.

The Monday night group has become close-knit over the years, but there is always room to add more to our circle. We meet both in person in the Education Office and via ZOOM. If you have not participated before and wish to join us, please contact Mark Hamilton or Vince Hardt so we can order a course book for you.
